	Influenza (A or B or unclear) ↑ circle the relevant type of influenza Check if the two necessary criteria have been met <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> →		5 days have passed since symptoms began (the day that the fever began is counted as Day 1)
			Until two days have passed since the day after the day on which the fever subsided
	Corona Virus Check if the two necessary criteria have been met <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> →		Until 5 days have passed, counting the day after the onset of symptoms as day 1 (if asymptomatic, the date on which the sample was taken)
			Until one day has passed since the day after symptoms began to improve *Improved means that fever has subsided without the use of fever-reducing medication and respiratory symptoms have improved.
	Measles	Until 3 days have passed since the fever subsided	
	Whooping Cough	Until the specific cough disappears or until 5 days of treatment with an appropriate antibacterial agent has been completed	
	Epidemic Parotitis (Mumps)	Until 5 days have passed since the swelling of the parotid, submandibular or sublingual glands first appeared and the patient's general condition has improved	
	Rubella	Until the rash disappears	
	Varicella (Chickenpox)	Until all the blisters have crusted over	
	Tuberculosis	Until a doctor determines that there is no risk of infection	
	Pharyngoconjunctival Fever (Swimming Pool Fever)	Until two days have passed since the main symptoms disappeared	
	Meningitis (Meningococcal disease)	Until a doctor determines that there is no risk of infection	
	Enterohemorrhagic E. Coli infection	Until a doctor determines that there is no risk of infection	
	Epidemic Keratoconjunctivitis (Pink Eye)	Until a doctor determines that there is no risk of infection	
	Acute Hemorrhagic Conjunctivitis	Until a doctor determines that there is no risk of infection	
	Streptococcal Infection	Until 24 hours have passed since starting antibiotics and symptoms such as a fever and rash have subsided	
	Viral Hepatitis (type A)	Until liver function returns to normal	
	Infectious Gastroenteritis	Until the vomiting and diarrhea symptoms subside and the student's overall condition has improved	
	Mycoplasma Infection	Until both the fever and cough subside	
	Erythema Infectiosum (Fifth Disease)	Students in good general health can attend school as the rash is not contagious during the rash stage	
	Herpangina	The student can attend school if they are in good health	
	Hand, foot and mouth disease	The student can attend school if they are in good health	
	Contagious Impetigo	If the affected area can be covered, the student can attend school. If it cannot be covered, wait until the scab falls off	
	Other infections ()	Until a doctor determines that there is no risk of infection
